








Secure financing for the Massachusetts Food Trust Program



Massachusetts: From Policy to Implementation

- Working with Baker Administration on the release of \$2 million in bond funding
- Working with agencies to prepare for implementation, development of program guidelines, etc.
- Working with Healthy Eating Community of Practice (DPH CoP) to convene stakeholders and develop recommendations for program guidelines
- Working with legislature on appropriation of additional funds
- Continue learning from successes and challenges in other states

Protect state funding for Mass in Motion



Pass legislation to encourage **shared use** of school recreational facilities to promote **physical activity** during non-school hours



Support adequate funding for Public Transit, Walking, and Biking Fair Share Amendment

Fair Share Amendment

Applies only to taxable income over \$1 million

Applies an additional 4% rate to this income

This will affect less than 1% of all Massachusetts households

• Will raise nearly \$1.5 billion in new, annual revenue

New revenue is dedicated to education and transportation

Polling Findings – MA voters June 2015

Who pays their fair share?


- 64% think millionaires pay less than their fair share
- 55% think the top 1% of households pay less than their fair share
- 52% think the wealthy pay less than their fair share

Do you support a higher tax rate for?

- 71% income above 1 million dollars
- 66% income that is in the top 1%
- 65% income above 750k
- 62% income above 500k
- 49% income above 300k


Our organizations support this legislation as the framework for zoning reform. We respectfully request your support for S 122.

Healthy Incentives Program (HIP) to help SNAP recipients access fruits and vegetables



FINI: Healthy Incentives Program (HIP)

- Expansion of the Healthy Incentives Pilot = Healthy Incentives Program
- Massachusetts statewide coalition
- Builds upon established HIP infrastructure and lessons learned
- Provides an incentive benefit at following statewide points of redemption:
 - Seasonal, winter and year-round Farmers' Markets
 - Farm Stands
 - Mobile Markets
 - Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) Programs
- Dollar for dollar match for F&V purchases, \$40/\$60/\$80 cap per month.
- Available to SNAP clients statewide
- Incentive instantly applied to SNAP customers' EBT card
- Culturally appropriate foods










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
















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
